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SIAL China embraces organic, May 6 - 9

Asia's largest food and beverage show kicks off today featuring nine Australian organic food and wine businesses.

SIAL China attracts 55,000 visitors each year and the 2015 event has over 2,700 exhibitors. It's the place to go for Asian food and beverage buyers.

Austrade expects China's appetite for organic food and beverages to grow by 20% each year until 2020.

Author, columnist, e-commerce entrepreneur and Australian Organic ambassador, Jessica Rudd, will give a presentation to delegates explaining what certified organic is and why Chinese consumers can trust Australian produce.

Jessica says, "After living in Beijing for five years I'm keen to see China have access to good quality food.

"Australia is seen as clean, safe, green and beautiful. It comes down to simple maths. Australia has 22 million hectares of certified organic farmland and a population of 23 million. China has 1.6 million hectares of certified organic farmland and over 1.3 billion mouths to feed," Jessica says.

"If Australian producers can scale up to meet the demand from this premium Chinese consumer, then there is a lot of opportunity."

Australian businesses; Arcadian Organic & Natural Meat Company, Coolibah Herbs, Eco Farms, Gemtree Wines, Kialla Pure Foods, Murray River Organics, Nature's Gift, Pana Chocolate and OZGANICS Organic Foods are all part of the multi level Australian Certified Organic display at SIAL China 2015.

Australian Certified Organic is a subsidiary of Australian Organic, the largest organic industry group in the country.

The display features a kitchen for food tastings prepared by Chef Kevin Yang and a meeting room.

Australian Organic's General Manager of Commercial, Joanne Barber, expects the display will attract a lot of interest from Asian buyers.

"Some of the businesses joining us at this event already have Chinese organic certification through Australian Certified Organic, which means they're in the position to export straight away. For others it will be a good testing ground to gauge the level of interest from buyers."

Australian Certified Organic is also participating in an Austrade presentation at the event.

Arcadian Organic & Natural Meat Company has over 120 certified organic suppliers in Australia.
